## Winston Churchill Memorial Trust *Grants for individual travel abroad*

Grants are awarded to individuals travelling anywhere in the world, for up to eight weeks, with the aim of gaining knowledge and experience which will enhance effectiveness at work and contribution to the community.

The Trust prefers to award Fellowships to people unlikely to obtain funding from other sources and will support British citizens only. Individual projects are considered, however, joint/group applications are not accepted. Grants do not cover attending courses or academic studies.
