Shanks First Fund

Grants for areas close to Shanks landfill sites

Grants are available for **community projects** throughout Great Britain, in the vicinity of Shanks landfill sites. These are located at: Brogborough/Stewartby, Pwllfawatkin, Dogsthorpe/Weldon, Bletchley/Calvert, Arlesey, Rossett/Chirk, Rotherham, Deerplay and Bennet Park.

Applications must be supported by the constitution, equal opportunities/environmental policies, audited accounts and a business plan.

Beacon Fellowship

Beacon is a charitable organisation set up to encourage individual contributions to charitable and social causes and to celebrate and showcase best practice in giving. Beacon awards annual prizes to individuals who have made exceptional contributions to charitable causes or to organisations that benefit the public.

An overall winner is selected every year who will be given a cash reward of £20,000, to be invested innovatively in a charity of their choice.
