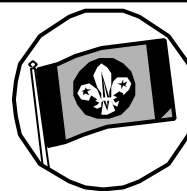


2.0 Running a Scout Fellowship



Introduction

Scout Fellowships exist in a number of different formats that range from local Fellowships, tied to Groups or Districts, to national and international Fellowships.

In addition, the Fellowship may have a specific focus or area of interest. Examples include:

Climbing	Parascending
Gang shows	Camp site
Amateur Radio	British Rail

So long as the Fellowship is involved in “providing active support” there is no limit to the form or structure a Scout Fellowship takes.
